

Ljubljana residents' attitude towards tourism

Summary

- A survey among residents on attitudes and perceptions of tourism in the Municipality of Ljubljana reveals interesting insights into residents' opinions on the impact of tourism on the urban environment. Key findings indicate that the majority of Ljubljana's residents (approximately three-quarters) maintain a positive attitude toward tourism, with the biggest challenges they perceive being overcrowding and high prices. Nevertheless, positive associations prevail, particularly in connection with green spaces, city events, and the upkeep of the city center.
- The city center is popular for walking, shopping, and visiting local establishments.
- Residents from Jarše, Šentvid, and Dravlje districts are the most satisfied with life in Ljubljana, while some from Posavje and Vič show a greater willingness to move if it would improve their living conditions.
- Opinions on activities and events in districts are divided. Residents of Sostro, Polje, Dravlje, Črnuče, and Moste express an above-average desire for more organized events, whereas residents of Rožnik, Center, Posavje, Trnovo, Jarše, and Bežigrad are less inclined towards a higher number of events in their district.



Sample

The research sample consisted of 1,420 residents of Ljubljana, collected in two waves (June and September 2024). Of these, 129 respondents were from the Center district (9.1%), while 1,291 (90.9%) were from other districts. Among the districts, the highest proportion of respondents came from Bežigrad (15.0%) and Šiška (11.9%), which also have the highest population share.

Among the respondents, 50.6% were men. The largest age group was 36 to 45 years old (23.8%), followed by those aged 46 to 55 (18.1%). The smallest proportions were among those under 25 (11.2%) and those aged 66 to 75 (12.9%). The majority of respondents hold a university degree or a master's degree under the Bologna system (58.2%), followed by those with a four-year secondary school or gymnasium education (30.9%). Only 10.4% of respondents have a vocational education or lower.


Less than half of the respondents have lived in Ljubljana for more than 40 years (40.9%), while less than a fifth (17.1%) have lived in the city for less than 10 years.

Less than one-tenth of the respondents work in the tourism sector.

Approximately half of the respondents live in privately owned apartments or houses without a mortgage, while just under a quarter (23.0%) pay rent (either market or non-market).




RESIDENTS' SATISFACTION





Activities in the City Center (in %)




Two-thirds of the residents of the Municipality of Ljubljana visit the city center at least once a week. The most common activities during their visits include walking, running errands, visiting cafés and restaurants, and shopping.

Number of Events in the Districts (in %)




40% of respondents would like more organised events in their districts. Among them, residents of Sostro, Polje, Dravlje, Črnuče, and Moste express an above-average desire for more events. On the other hand, residents of Rožnik, Centre, Posavje, Trnovo, Jarše, and Bežigrad show a below-average interest in additional events.

Residents of Bežigrad express an above-average interest in more art exhibitions and a greater variety of international cuisine in the hospitality sector, while residents of Trnovo show an above-average interest in more music events.

In general, most respondents are satisfied with life in Ljubljana, with an average score of 4.6 on a 6-point scale.The most satisfied residents are from Jarše, Šentvid, and Dravlje, while the least satisfied are from Posavje and Vič.Residents of these two districts also expressed an above-average willingness to move out of Ljubljana.
